Letter of His Holiness Pope Francis to the Faithful for the Month of May 2020

On April 25, 2020, the Feast of St. Mark the Evangelist, Pope Francis issued a letter in which he wrote:

“The month of May is approaching, a time when the People of God express with particular intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family. The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this “family” aspect, also from a spiritual point of view.

For this reason, I want to encourage everyone to rediscover the beauty of praying the Rosary at home in the month of May. This can be done either as a group or individually; you can decide according to your own situations, making the most of both opportunities. The key to doing this is always simplicity, and it is easy also on the internet to find good models of prayers to follow.

I am also providing two prayers to Our Lady that you can recite at the end of the Rosary, and that I myself will pray in the month of May, in spiritual union with all of you. I include them with this letter so that they are available to everyone.”

Every year, the Church seeks the special intercession of the Mother of God during the month of May. This year we seek the assistance of Our Lady all the more earnestly as we face together the effects of the global pandemic. In that spirit, plans are underway for the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) to consecrate the nation of Canada to the care of our Blessed Mother on May 1, 2020.

Based on discussion with the leadership of the CCCB, the Executive Committee of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) met and affirmed the fittingness of May 1, 2020, as an opportunity for the bishops of the United States to reconsecrate our nation to Our Lady and to do so under the title, *Mary, Mother of the Church*, doing so on the same day that our brother bishops to the north consecrate Canada under the same title.

This will give the Church the occasion to pray for Our Lady's continued protection of the vulnerable, healing of the unwell, and wisdom for those who work to cure this terrible virus. In this Easter Season we continue to journey with our Risen Lord that among the graces of this time may be healing and strength, especially for all who are burdened by the many effects of the COVID pandemic.

"Through the Valley of Darkness"

The Fourth Sunday of Easter has become known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" since passages from John 10:1-18 are the basis for the Gospel proclaimed at Mass on this day. The artistic portrayal of Christ as the Good Shepherd is one of the earliest Christian depictions.

This image showing Jesus carrying a lamb on his shoulders is found in the catacombs of Rome during a time when it was illegal to create more explicitly Christian art. The art left behind in the burial locations of early Christians offers us a window into their faith.

On this *Good Shepherd Sunday 2020* during this difficult time which everyone faces, may we turn to the words of Psalm 23 that has been prayed by people of faith through the centuries recalling that "*The LORD is my shepherd*" and walks with us by our side during the difficult times and moments of our earthly journeys.

Por eso, he pensado proponerles a todos que redescubramos la belleza de rezar el Rosario en casa durante el mes de mayo. Ustedes pueden elegir, según la situación, rezarlo juntos o de manera personal, apreciando lo bueno de ambas posibilidades. Pero, en cualquier caso, hay un secreto para hacerlo: la sencillez; y es fácil encontrar, [incluso en internet](#), buenos esquemas de oración para seguir.

Además, les ofrezco dos textos de oraciones a la Virgen que pueden recitar al final del Rosario, y que yo mismo diré durante el mes de mayo, unido espiritualmente a ustedes. Los adjunto a esta carta para que estén a disposición de todos.'
